# Instructions to Authors *Journal of Food Allergy*

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#### Introduction

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JFA follows the guidelines and policies of <u>COPE</u>, <u>WAME</u>, and the <u>Recommendations for the Conduct</u>, <u>Reporting</u>, <u>Editing</u>, <u>and Publication of Scholarly Work in Medical Journals</u> formulated by the <u>International Committee of Medical Journal Editors</u> (ICMJE) and, as such, it requires authors to adhere to the highest standards in ethical publishing.

Please review OceanSide's <u>Journal Ethical Publishing Policies</u>, <u>Statements</u>, <u>and Other Policies</u> and follow the <u>Manuscript Submission Guidelines</u> (below) to upload your manuscript together with the required publication forms at the <u>JFA's submission site</u>. Upon submitting your manuscript, it will immediately be screened; and only manuscripts of sufficient quality and consistency with the *JFA* aim and scope (described above) will advance to the formal peer review process. Additionally, please note that manuscripts that do not conform to the Manuscript Submission Guidelines will be returned to the author(s) for revision before initiating peer review. Please contact the editorial offices with any questions regarding the submission process.

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*JFA* utilizes an online system for manuscript submission and peer review. This system allows authors to submit their work electronically and check on the review process's status. To access the electronic system, visit <a href="http://jfa.msubmit.net">http://jfa.msubmit.net</a>. This technology requires all manuscript files to be uploaded separately as follows:

- 1.) cover letter
- 2.) manuscript (including title page, abstract, text, references, and figure **legends** only), excluding table and figure files
- 3.) tables (can be consolidated into one "tables" file or uploaded separately)
- 4.) figures (uploaded each as a separate file)
- 5.) Publication Forms
  - 1. publication rights agreement
  - 2. <u>conflict of interest</u> (CoI)

As further detailed below, it is a prerequisite that Publication Rights Agreement forms and Conflict of Interest (CoI) documents be submitted (uploaded) to be considered for peer review. Download blank "PUBLISHING RIGHTS AGREEMENT forms" from the JFA website and blank "CoI forms" from the ICJME website here. Submit completed forms via electronic transmission (as directed below), or alternatively by email or fax to the JFA editorial staff; important - do not submit your completed ICJME "disclosure form" to ICJME. To submit your forms electronically, please visit the JFA manuscript submission website and upload them to the manuscript submission page (http://jfa.msubmit.net).

Electronic manuscript submission is a four-step process that is described step-by-step at <a href="https://www.jfa.msubmit.net">www.jfa.msubmit.net</a>. *JFA* does not accommodate the submission of paper manuscripts.

SELECTING A MANUSCRIPT TYPE: When uploading your completed manuscript, you will be required to designate your work as one of the following manuscript types.

- Solicited Meeting paper: (Restricted to solicited/invited manuscripts) If the solicited manuscript was written based upon an invitation to present information at a specific conference (such as EFACC), please select this manuscript type. Components indicated by a checkmark below should appear in the order they are presented here (i.e. title page, abstract, manuscript text, acknowledgment, references, figure legends, tables). Figures should be uploaded separately. If your work was previously presented, the corresponding scientific meeting should be included on the title page. Word limit: 3,000 words
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- *Pro/con debate:* An original manuscript discussing both the pro and con side of a controversial issue in food allergy that is important to clinical practice. Limited to 1500 words and with an optional figure or table.

- Letters to the Editor: Letters are limited to brief communications which specifically relate to a recently published article in the Journal. Letters to the editor will be reviewed by the Editor and in most cases responded to by the author(s) of the referenced publication. Letters to the Editor are limited to 500 words and 5 references. Because letters to the editor are sometimes cited, keywords are required for submission. Letters to the Editor will be published exclusively online, with exceptions per the Editor
- *Case Reports:* Except by invitation, the *JFA* does not encourage the submission of case reports.
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## **MANUSCRIPT COMPONENTS**

# ✓ Cover letter:

The cover letter should declare: 1) the authors' intentions to publish in *JFA*; 2) the Work is an original; 3) all authors have met all four requirements for authorship per ICJME Recommendations; 4) the Work is not currently under consideration by another journal; 5) while the Work is under consideration by the Journal, it shall not be submitted elsewhere; 6) the Work does not infringe upon any copyrighted or proprietary rights; and 7) neither the submitted Work nor a similar manuscript has been previously published (except for clinical trial results on a clinical trial registry site, data contained in assessment reports published by regulatory agencies or in abstract form). If a similar manuscript has been published, please provide an explanation as to how the Work differs.

### ✓ *Title page*:

- Relevant and concise (no more than 15 words) title in sentence format (capitalize only proper nouns). Do not include abbreviations or use trade names in the title. A 7-word running title will also be required at time of submission.
- First name, middle initial, and last name of each author with the highest academic degrees included (do not include fellowships). All contributing authors should be listed, including professional writers who meet authorship criteria (see OceanSide Ethical Publishing Policies).
- Name of departments, institutions, and/or corporate affiliations of each author to which the work should be attributed; (see Conflict of Interest below).
- Please list any disclaimers, disclosures, and conflicts of interest for each author pertaining to this work. Please reconcile conflicts of interest for each author to match those submitted with each author's submitted conflict of interest form (see OceanSide Ethical Publishing Policy).
- If this work is supported through NIH funding, this must be noted in the footnote.. If the author(s) indicates that their research was sponsored by the NIH, the manuscript will be sent to PubMed Central in compliance with the public access posting requirement.
- Acknowledgment of Financial Support/Funding. (see Conflict of Interest below)
- IRB Statement: As per <u>ICMJE guidelines</u>, when submitting manuscripts to *JFA* that involve human subjects, or human-derived data, it is required to include a statement describing the informed consent

- and approval by the institutional ethics committee or the Institutional Review Board (IRB) including the full name of the institution that provided approval and the approval number. Statements describing IRB/ethics committee approval as well as informed consent and/or ethical treatment of animal must be included in the methods section of the manuscript.
- Key Words: (**7 key words are mandatory**) Selecting appropriate key words is essential to your research being discovered by others.
- If your work was previously presented, the corresponding scientific meeting should be included on the title page in the format of, "name of the meeting, date of presentation, city, and state (or country)". i.e. "Presented at the "Eastern Food Allergy & Comorbidity Conference, January 1, 2023, Palm Beach, Florida".
- Include the corresponding author's email address and telephone number.
- ✓ Abstract: All manuscript types with the exception of the "Letters to the Editor" should include a structured abstract, no longer than 300 words, to precede article. Only include acronyms or abbreviations if the phrase appears more than three times in the abstract. The abstract should NOT contain brand names, trademarks or references. Clinical trial registration numbers should be listed at the end of the abstract. The abstract of original manuscripts should be structured into sections as described below. For other manuscript types (solicited meeting manuscript, review, pro/con debate), structuring may be optional.
  - Background Describe the problem that prompted the study
  - Objective Describe the purpose of the study
  - Methods Describe how the study was conducted
  - Results Describe the most important findings
  - Conclusion Describe the most important conclusion drawn from the study
- ✓ *Text*: The specified lengths (word counts) for the manuscript types listed above do not include word counts of the abstract and references. However, please include the abstract and references in the same file as the text when uploading. Please insert **line numbers** into text for the ease of peer review. The manuscript should be typed double-spaced in a standard font such as Times New Roman, Arial, Courier, or Helvetica, in size 12. Text should be written in clear and concise English. For authors whose primary language is not English, it is recommended to obtain professional writing assistance to avoid grammatical and syntax issues. In your summary/conclusion, please refrain from self-laudatory language and qualitative characterizations of your work such as claims of priority or novelty.
